interested in being a part of the process for promoting woodturning. She served on the GCWA Board in 2002 and became a two-term president from 2003-2004.

After 35 years as a drama teacher and alternative school counselor, she retired and moved with her husband to the central Texas area. After taking off two years from turning (she was the general contractor for building her new house), she was glad to get back to it. As soon as she could get her lathes unpacked, she joined the Brazos Valley Woodturners in the Waco area. She currently is serving as president. They are a small club, but a growing group. Again, her focus is on promoting woodturning, especially with younger turners. She is also serving as vice-president-elect of the Southwest Association of Turners (SWAT).

Her turnings have appeared in several shows: (1) Galveston Grand Opera House Eight Artist Show featuring Hurricane Ike turned wood—2010, (2) Houston Center for Contemporary Craft juried show, "Texas Turned"—2009, (3) Houston Center for Contemporary Craft juried show, "Wood Turned Art"—2005, (4) Houston Woodcarver's Show—2004.

She has enjoyed demonstrating for her local clubs—Gulf Coast Woodturners and Brazos Valley Woodturners. She was also a regional demonstrator in the 2009 Southwest Association of Turners Symposium. Her pieces have been in the Fleury Gallery, Houston, TX; Eagles Nest Gallery, La Porte, TX; and Ice House Pottery and Gallery, Luling, TX

In a short two weeks, SWAT will be taking place in Waco (August 27-29). You can still register at the door. This symposium is one of the largest, regional woodturning extravaganzas in the world. You shouldn't really miss it. It's in your own backyard! There'll be great demonstrations, vendor displays and sales and woodturning camaraderie. Be there or be square (ooh, that takes on some new meaning when you are referring to woodturning!).
