Shavings

I got to turn some nice handles for that slick Rockler pizza cutter kit and Lacer's ice cream scoop kit. Those were fun even though I'm still not happy with the fit between the pizza cutter handle and the hilt on the cutter itself. Sandy Jarrell saw the error of my way and told me how to chuck up the handle to get the best fit. So I guess I'll re-do that handle sometime soon.

June has had too many distractions that seemed to interfere with quality turning time like my daughter's graduation, crazy brothers and nephews visiting, college orientation, neighborhood block parties, Father's Day and those exciting Maverick basketball playoff games (Go Mavs!). One of the biggest distractions/disrup-

I had the AC cranked in

the shop but it just can't keep up with those temps. 
