the other guy or gal to do it. Don't let good ideas wither on the vine because you didn't bend over, pick it up, and run with it.


I look forward to the future of WNTx. It'll be exciting to see how we all steer this ship and where we'll head.

what sheer scraping is or which direction your cut should go; this is the video for you. The index for this video has 25 topics and every one is covered in detail. This is a long video of 107 minutes but it is easy to go to any topic that you are interested in or play them all and settle down to a though narrative by a turner who has been turning for many years. So even if you do not have a hollowing system, he makes a long stem goblet for his presentation and most of his techniques can be utilized by anyone turning a bowl. A few of the 25 topics are:

Roughing, working in a series, preventing vibration, ABC's bevel support, carbide cutter intro, outside of the goblet, and cleaning the bottom. Oh yes, sheer scrape in also in there.

It is interesting to note he does not use a chuck and does not even own one so you say you do not have a bunch of fancy equipment like one of members, no problem Santa won't mind a bit about you viewing this video. So give this video a chance and I believe you will come away with a better understanding of turning. Of course it is just full of hollowing tips on laser set up and use and the new Hunter nanograin carbide cutter, not to mention advanced hollowing techniques.




Empty Bowls

The Empty Bowls count stands at 80 as of the end of November (including what was brought to the November meeting.)




Saturday, December 8, 2012

6:30 PM - Door Prize drawing, Raffle and Auction (bring lots of \$\$\$ for the auction) Also, start working now to turn some items for the auction.


Driving Directions:


Heading south from I30 on I-820 E. - Take EXIT 30A toward Craig St. Take the 1st right onto Craig St.



Things to Bring to the Christmas Banquet




Yourself and your family including children and parents (but leave Fluffy and Spike at home).

Your appetite along with a dessert AND your choice of either a salad or a vegetable.


Some of your favorite turnings that you would like to donate to the live auction. This is one of the major sources of income for our club to be able to provide the quality programs that we provide.
