<http://www.armadillowoodworks.com/> from Austin will present an **ABSOLUTELY FREE TO WNT MEMBERS**, All-Day Demonstration at the regular club meeting place located at the Handley-Meadowbrook Lions Club, 6013 Craig Street, Fort Worth, Texas 76112 <http://www.wntx.org/> All non-members attending the meeting will be charged \$10.00 at the door to help cover our expenses. If you have been to SWAT you may have seen Craig perform demos there over the last several years but he will present **FOUR DIFFERENT DEMONSTRATIONS ON OCTOBER 17th**. Craig is a full time woodturner and is in demand for demonstrations and hands-on classes throughout the United States. His lively style and high energy presentations will keep you inspired and motivated to be a lot more creative yourself for months to come.

ON Thursday OCTOBER 29th at the regular club meeting Janice Levi will present a program on “Pyrography 101”. Visitors are welcome.

Attendees will learn about the four types of pyrography tools with a demo of each.

They will learn about branding and art burning with demos of each.

They will learn where and how to find patterns and how to put them on wood.

They will learn of the basic burning techniques for the writing tip, skew, and shader.

We will talk about color on wood but it will not be part of the demo.

ON Friday OCTOBER 30th Janice Levi will teach two Introduction to Pyrography classes. The morning class runs from 9 AM until 12 PM. The class fee is \$30 for the half day class. **All class fees must be paid by Thursday, September 24th**. At this writing there is **only one opening left in the morning class**.

The afternoon class runs from 1 PM until 4 PM. The class fee is also \$30 for the half day class. At this writing there are **only two openings left for the afternoon class**.

Attendees will learn about four types of pyrography tools they can use with an opportunity to use each.

They will learn the difference between branding and art pyrography and try each.

They will learn practice burning on scrap wood to learn the various techniques.

We will use a writing tip, a skew to draw straight lines, and a shading tip.

They will learn to transfer patterns to flat and round wood.

We will also look at where patterns can be found—free.

Finally, each student will transfer a pattern to wood and burn a finished product.

Each class member is responsible for their own woodburning (pyrography) unit equipped with a writing tip, skew pen, and shader. There may be a couple of loaner woodburners available if they have not already been taken.

Woodburning units are available in the DFW area from Harbor Freight, WoodWorld, Rockler, Woodcraft, and some craft stores. **The Harbor Freight units are acceptable for the “Introduction classes” on Friday but are not suitable in the Advanced class on Saturday.**

ON Saturday OCTOBER 31ST. Janice Levi will teach one all-day class for people with some woodburning experience. The all-day class runs from 9 AM until 4 PM. The class fee is \$60. **All class fees must be paid by Thursday, September 24th**. At this writing there is **only one opening left**. Each class member is responsible for their own woodburning (pyrography) unit equipped with a writing tip, skew pen, and shader. Attendees will quickly review basic woodburning techniques—curved lines, straight lines, and shading. We will then practice on scrap wood new techniques of temperature control and pressure control to create lightness and darkness in the burnings. We will also look at creative patterns in wood using Zentangle. Finally, if the students bring a small turning of any design, we will put the pattern on the wood and burn it, using variations in light and dark. If students do not have a turning, we will create the final design on a flat board.

All classes will be held in the shop of Dr. Jimmie Gill at 3425 Meadow Oaks Drive, Haltom City, TX 76117
